Respite after strong winds, light rain to stay for 3 days

Thunderstorms, Rain Likely For 2 Days; But AQI Still 'Poor'

New Delhi: Delhites got a much-needed respite on Saturday with the maximum temperature dropping by about two degrees Celsius. Several parts of the city witnessed light rain and strong winds after dusk on Friday and Saturday.

According to the weather department, Delhi and nearby areas are likely to receive patchy rain over the next few days with the maximum intensity likely on Monday. High moisture led to the formation of vertically developed clouds on Saturday, which brought the daytime temperature down and gave Delhites a huge relief from the severe heatwave the city experienced a day earlier.

According to India Meteorological Department (IMD), the maximum temperature on Saturday at Safdarjung, the city's base station, was recorded at 42.4 degrees Celsius, three degrees above the season's av-

erage. A day earlier, it was 44.4 degrees. The minimum temperature was recorded at 29.8 degrees Celsius, three notches above the season's average. On Friday, it was 28.2 degrees.

The humidity levels at Safdarjung oscillated between 38 and 20% on Saturday. A day earlier, the city had experienced a maximum of 71% humidity.

Though the maximum temperature dipped at Safdarjung, the mercury crossed 44 degrees Celsius at several weather sta-

tions in the city, including Mungerpur, Noida Sector, Pitampura and Sports Complex (near Akshardham). There is a possibility of thunderstorms on Sunday as well, while the maximum intensity of rainfall is likely on Monday," explained Mahesh Palawat, vice-president, meteorology and climate change, Skymet.

On Sunday, the maximum and minimum temperatures are likely to hover around 41 and 27 degrees Celsius, respectively.

The air quality, meanwhile, oscillated within the "poor" category. The air quality index (AQI), on a scale of 0 to 500, on Saturday was 285 as against 266 day earlier. "AQI today indicates 'poor' air quality with PM10 as the primary pollutant. Dust contributes to approx 7% to PM10. For the next three days (22nd, 23rd, 24th), peak wind speed is likely to be approx 18km/h causing moderate dispersion and AQI is said to be within 'poor'", said a statement from SAFAR.

Western disturbance: All these combinations are leading to rain in the region. There is a possibility of thunderstorms on Sunday as well, while the maximum intensity of rainfall is likely on Monday," explained Mahesh Palawat, vice-president, meteorology and climate change, Skymet.

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Woman found dead with adult daughters

New Delhi: A woman and her two children were found dead under mysterious circumstances at their residence in south-west Delhi's Vasant Vihar area on Saturday evening. Police are probing all possible angles.

The station house officer along with other staff reached the spot. "The doors and windows were closed. We managed to open the door and found that a gas cylinder was partially opened and there was a suicide note," the officer added.

Police added that on entering another room, three bodies were found lying on the bed.

The deceased were identified as Manju, and her two daughters Anshika and Anku. According to the police, the woman must have been around 50 years old and both her daughters were adults.

Manju's husband passed away last April due to Covid-19. Since then, she was supposedly under depression, police said.

The woman was bedridden and could hardly walk. Copse also found some burning candles in the room.

"Prima facie, it appears that they died due to suffocation, however both angles — suicide or accidental death — are being probed. A postmortem will be conducted on Sun-

Sisodia reviews progress made in job projects

New Delhi: Almost two months after the Delhi government presented the Roxy Budget promising 20 lakh new job opportunities in five years, chief minister Arvind Kejriwal on Saturday reviewed the progress made so far on various projects.

Asking the officials to expedite the implementation of the schemes, Sisodia said imple-

menting the decisions made by the government are not a mere "tabletop exercise". "We need to involve different agencies and people to ensure maximum possible outcomes for the residents of Delhi," Sisodia said in a statement.

Dialogue and Develop-

ment Commission (DDC) of Delhi vice-chairman Jasmin Shah and Kalkaji MLA Atishi also attended the meeting. The government's proposed schemes reviewed by the deputy CM included the cloud kitchen policy, redevelopment of markets, retail shopping festival, wholesale market, food truck policy and startup policy.

The government in a statement said the select committee constituted earlier this month for the selection of iconic markets for redevelopment has mapped out the selection criteria and detailed designs for the four pilot and market-specific studies carried out. "A key focus of the government is on boosting the night economy of Delhi through this policy," the statement read.
